• **Legislative reform:** drafting or commenting on probation legislation while working for the Ministry of Justice/ Romania, as well as during assignments for OSCE/Albania and Helsinki Committee Netherlands/Moldova; while working for the Probation Department in Romania, contributed to the drafting and revising of different pieces of legislation, which were subsequently adopted: **Probation Law, Methodological Norms of the Probation Law, Victim Protection Law, Probation Councillor's Status Law**; delivered short term expertise in transition countries (e.g. Albania - comments of the new **Criminal and Criminal Procedure Codes** and on the new **Probation Law**; Moldova - comments on the **Enforcement Code**).

• **Training and Teaching:** *run training needs assessment* in many institutional contexts such as: Romanian Ministry of Justice/ Probation Department, Romanian Prison Departments, Moldavian National Institute of Probation; National Probation Service in Croatia.

Run initial and continuing training sessions for probation staff in Kosovo, Jordan, Serbia and Montenegro,

Delivered courses every year at the University of Bucharest on subjects like: working with offenders, social work in prison and **comparative probation**; Provided **training to judiciary** in implementing alternative to custody and also in implementing framework decisions (Romanian National Institute of Magistracy, 2015). Editing and co-authoring the manual for probatin staff working with violent extremist offenders in Kenya. Running two summer schools on working with returnees – Barcelona (CEP, EuroPris and European Forum for Restorative Justice).
